

2022 Westmount Pinot Gris Willamette Valley, Oregon



The Willamette Valley runs from the Columbia River in Portland 60 miles south to Eugene. Bordered to the west by the Coast Range and to the east by the Cascade Mountains, the Valley is protected from environmental extremes. The Valley floor is an ancient seabed overlaid with nutrient-rich gravel, silt, rock, and boulders brought by the Missoula Floods during the last Ice Age. 2021 brought new record high temperatures all across Oregon. While slightly worrisome at the moment, the 2021 vintage is quickly gaining momentum as a classic vintage for Oregon.

Fermented and aged entirely in stainless steel tanks. Aromas of orange blossom, key lime, and spiced pear on the nose. The palate shows lively notes of sweet citrus, crisp apple, white pineapple, ginger, juniper, lemongrass, and coriander. Vibrant and balanced with an expressive finish. Pair with grilled shrimp, tuna nigiri, raw oysters, or a creamy mushroom pasta.

2021 Terranoble "Azara" Cabernet Sauvignon Colchagua Valley, Chile



Well-regarded for intense and exceptionally high quality red wines, the Colchagua Valley is situated in the southern part of Chile's Rapel Valley, about 2 hours south of Santiago, with many of the best vineyards lying in the foothills of the Coastal Range. Fermented in stainless steel tanks and aged in both stainless steel and French barriques for 12 months. The wine feels fruity, fresh and elegant on the nose, with predominant aromas of fresh and ripe red fruits such as berries and plums, all enhanced by a slight touch of menthol. Elegant and well-structured on the palate, unctuous and refreshing, this Cabernet Sauvignon intends to highlight acidity, tension, and sharpness over the variety's classical concentration and tannic structure. Pair with beef stew, grilled lamb chops, chorizo sausages, or lentil stew.

2021 Domini Venti "Tremenalto" Garganega Soave Classico, Italy



The Soave Classico region is a sub-zone within the larger Soave DOC in the Veneto region of northeastern Italy, located in the hilly areas between the towns of Soave and Monteforte d'Alpone. 'Tremenalto' is one of the 33 Unità Geografiche Aggiuntive (UGAs), or additional geographic units of the Soave Classico wine region. It is known for its steep slopes and volcanic soils. In particularly hot years this area benefits from the cooler summer temperatures thanks to the breeze coming from the north, known as the Bora. Aged 10% in French barriques for 3 months, the rest is aged in stainless steel tanks. Nose of peaches and stone fruits, white flowers and subtle almondy notes. Pleasing texture and yummy freshness. Pair with fontina and goat cheeses, stuffed pasta shells with ricotta, arancini, or pan seared petrale sole.

2021 Mount Langi Cliff Edge Shiraz Grampians, Victoria, Australia



Established in 1969, now home to one of Australia's most iconic cool climate wines, Langi Shiraz. Mount Langi Ghiran – Aboriginal for home of the yellow tailed black cockatoo – is set amongst the dramatic backdrop of the Great Dividing Range in the Grampians region of Victoria. The first vines were planted on the property in the late 1800s, but it's when the Fratin family, immigrants from Italy, replanted in 1969 that Mount Langi Ghiran really came to be. 100% whole berry fermented in both small open, and large, open-top concrete fermenters. 14-month barrel maturation in French barriques, approx 30% new. On the nose are red and black cherries, ripe raspberry, boysenberry and a lick of baking spice. On the palate, Morello cherry, blackberries and raspberries along with a mix of cloves, cardamom and white pepper. Fine tannins and an understated length provided by a delicate acid line. Pair with grilled lamb chops, bean stew, eggplant parmesan, and Indian curries.

2015 Bocelli "Alcide" Rosso Toscana IGT, Italy



A fifty-fifty blend of cabernet sauvignon and sangiovese, Made from 70 year-old Sangiovese vines and plush Cabernet Sauvignon, 'Alcide' is named for the grandfather of Alberto and Andrea Bocelli (the famed Italian tenor). When grandfather Alcide Bocelli was running the family farm in the 1930's, he made the wine, grew the wheat, and branded the cattle with his initials, "AB." When his son was born, the practical and humorous papa decided to name his boy Alessandro Bocelli, in part so he wouldn't have to change the "AB" brand on all his cattle. When his sons were born, Alessandro decided to name his boys Andrea and Alberto, keeping the "AB" tradition alive. This takes time to open past its smoky oak to red fruit scents of currants and cranberries. It's a warm, toasty red, hinting at earthy mushroom scents in the finish. Classic pairing with braised duck, but try Bolognese, truffled pasta, or pecorino cheese.

2019 Oratoire domaine St. Martin "Les Douyes" Cairanne, Rhone Valley, France



A blend of 40% Grenache Noir, 30% Mourvèdre, 20% Syrah, 5% Carignan, and 5% Counoise. Domaine de l'Oratoire Saint-Martin covers 25 hectares located in the village of Cairanne only. Most of the vineyard is in the northeast of the commune, at an altitude of 200 meters on steep hills in an area commonly called "the mountain" in the localities of Saint-Martin, Les Douyes and Coustias. The vineyard is located in the southern part of the Rhône valley, in the Cairanne appellation whose soils are varied: rocky, clayish or calcareous. This cuvée comes from our old vines located on the middle and lower hillside and farmed organically and biodynamically.

The nose shows red fruit and blonde tobacco notes, while the palate is well-structured and ethereal, with smooth tannins and a spicy, peppery finish. Pair with grilled flank sirloin, Tomme des Bauges cheese or pork shank confit.
