

2022 Ogier 'Artesis' Blanc Cotes du Rhone, France



A blend of Grenache blanc, Bourboulenc, Clairette, Roussanne, and Viognier. The pebble terroirs impart strength whilst the clay-limestone and sand soils impart finesse. The Mistral winds offer significant phytosanitary advantages. The climate and soils are well suited to the production of rich and fruity wines. The climate requires good balance between the varieties in order to retain freshness. The vines are primarily trained and yields are low. Sustainable viticulture, manual harvests and de-stemming before fermentation. Varietal selections from the Villa franchian terraces of St Marcel d'Ardèche, the slopes of Avignon and the hillsides of Roquemaure in the heart of the Southern Rhône Valley. Rich and complex nose. Exotic and citrus fruits blend with apricot and white peach with notes of spices and vanilla. Superb balance and harmony on the palate where roundness meets freshness with a remarkably long finish. Pair with baked halibut, saba nigiri, roasted chicken, or creamed spinach.

2022 Chateau d'Oupia Rouge Minervois, France



A blend of 50% Carignan, 40% Syrah, and 10% Grenache. André Iché inherited an impressive 13th century castle and a large estate in the barren Minervois region. Iché was never a member of his village coop, tended his very old vines and made his wines but sold everything in bulk to local négociants. This bottling comes from the older vines of the estate, some up to 100 years old and on the hillsides of Minervois, with some Carignan up to 100 years old. They are sustainably farmed and harvested partly by hand and partly by machine. The Carignan remains in whole clusters and undergoes a full carbonic maceration; the Syrah and Grenache are destemmed and macerated up to 30 days. Fermentation and aging takes place in concrete vats. The wine is bottled without fining or filtration. Wonderfully clean and pure, with an exuberant personality, and gobs of rich, peppery, red and black fruit. Pair with beef casserole, rabbit in mushroom and wine sauce, or cassoulet.

2023 Hill Family Barrel Blend White Napa Valley



A blend of 61% Chardonnay, 15% Albarino, 14% Sauvignon Blanc, 5% Muscat Canelli, 3% Viognier and 2% Semillon. 2023 marks the inaugural production of a white wine produced under the Barrel Blend label, which is in the Hill Family Estate portfolio of wines. With bounteous crops and excellent weather, we were able to preserve the acidity and freshness of our white varieties. During blending sessions this combination came out a winner, pleasing everyone with the zippy acidity of the Albarino and the rich fruit from our Chardonnay sites. Lovely aromatics from Sauvignon Blanc, Muscat Canelli, Viognier, and Semillon completed the blend and made it worthy of the surfing talent of Moana Jones Wong, who is featured on the label riding an epic wave at the famed Pipeline surf break in Oahu! Aromas of apricot, pear, honeysuckle and orange meringue pie. On the palate, an initial roundness is balanced by natural acidity along with a hint of oak that merges with flavors of stone fruit and apple. The multiple layers, intriguing character and long finish has this wines creaming to be paired with Thai food, grilled chicken or fish tacos.

2021 Guillot-Gonin Beaujolais “Les Charmes” Morgon, France



Morgon is a Beaujolais wine region and one of the 10 Crus of Beaujolais, within the Bourgogne appellation. The Morgon region is located on the western slopes of the Saône River, overlooked by Mont du Py. A domain born from passions of two winegrowers, Corinne and Jean-Philippe follow a reasoned culture on 35ha of vines with several appellations of Beaujolais. Since the beginning of the 19th century, they have offered exclusively the wines of Domaine Guillot Gonin. 5 generations have succeeded one another on the estate since 1805, each one bringing its own contribution. For this natural cuvée, without sulphites added, the indigenous yeasts have carried out their successive transformations, with the aim of obtaining a long, calm and stylish vinification, and thus to allow the wine to develop the full expression of its terroir. Aromas of mixed red and black fruits. Powerful and balanced, very fine and silky. Pair with poultry, meats in sauce and goat Brie.

2022 1467 Cellars Pinot Noir Calesa Vineyard, Petaluma Gap



A blend of 95% Pinot Noir and 5% Petite Sirah. 1467 Cellars' story is interwoven with the tale of one man's pursuit of the American Dream. In the 1950s, Juan Roland, our family's patriarch, left the quaint town of Acopinalco del Peñon in Tlaxcala, Mexico, and journeyed to the vast expanses of the United States. Juan's path led him to the Bracero program, an initiative during the late 1950s and early 1960s that offered short-term agricultural contracts. His grandson, Erik Ayala, now takes the mantle as the chief winemaker at 1467 Cellars. He also makes wine at Pride Mountain Vineyards. Presents a luxurious blend of dark fruit aromas and flavors. The warm tones of black plum, black currant, and dried blueberry are elegantly intertwined with subtle nuances of wild sage and cedar.

On the palate, it delivers a rich and polished experience with a spiced finish that gracefully lingers. Pair w/ Liberty Duck and pomegranate au jus, deep fried turkey and cranberries, Emmenthaler and Gruyere cheeses.

2021 Details by Sinegal Cabernet Sauvignon Sonoma County



A blend of 80% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Merlot, 4% Petite Syrah, and 2% Cabernet Franc. The history of Sinegal Estate Winery in Napa Valley, California dates back to 1879, when Alton Williams planted the first vines on the property. The property was originally known as the Inglewood Estate, and was acquired by Williams in 1879. The property has changed ownership several times over the years, passing through four families before David Sinegal purchased it in 2013. The 2021 DETAILS Cabernet Sauvignon is crafted from the finest appellations in Sonoma County. The majority of the Cabernet Sauvignon for the blend comes from Sonoma Valley. Knights Valley is a cooler climate for Cabernet Sauvignon, which bring elegance, nuance, and acid structure to the blend. On the nose, there are elegant aromas of violets and sweet toffee fol-

lowed by fresh raspberries, spiced tobacco, and potpourri. Flavors of black cherry and cassis are met with a vibrant minerality and a lingering, bright acidity. Pair with savory meats, hard cheeses, and herb sauces.
